- Funding vs. funding withdrawal
- Government priorities vs. funded projects
- Independence Vs external dependence
- Sustainability vs short term development plans
- Leaderships Accountability vs. performance
- Fragmentations vs integrations & systems approach

Where are the areas of focus

- Poverty reduction strategies (politicize)
- Selective health programs and interventions
 - MCAH, NHIS (UHC), Diseases and programs, etc.
- Selective educational interventions and programs
 - Improvement in tertiary education
- Improved gender and female empowerment

Which areas are most neglected?

- Aligning the SDG goals to key political agendas or vice versa
- Pursuing multi-sectoral approach to addressing institutional challenges
- Strengthening implementation through accountability mechanisms
- Financing and resources sustainability to support the programs initiated under SGD

- Adapting policies to support different contextual needs
- Adopting a systems approach to health & other social indicators — limiting vertical ways of achieving the SDG
- Harnessing health, educational, social and environmental improvements to poverty reduction

What position do we require to adopt?

- Systems or integrative approach
- Multidisciplinary approach
- Greater sense of autonomy and accountability
- Provide multiple perspectives
- Go beyond evidence generation...
- Create platforms for dialogue

What support do we require?

- Address fragmentation in research and selected/vertical interventions must be reconsidered for multi-sectoral action
- Collaboration and partnership
 - Working with the Communities and local government
 - working with policymakers and practitioners
 - Private sector & other sectors
 - Research institutions locally and regionally
- Research funding to encourage multi-disciplinary and actual lessons
- Support required for flexible and innovative
